Volunteer

Every summer vital ministry areas at Green Lake Conference Center are served by a group of almost 100 faithful volunteers!



We seek volunteer applicants for positions with the following:

- Desire to serve in a Christian environment supporting the mission of Green Lake by enhancing programs and conferences, showing personal concern for guests, and assisting in whatever ways are needed.
- Skills, interests and experience in specific areas of need.
- Good physical health to carry out normal and routine tasks; physical stamina is required in many positions.
- Sufficient financial resources to volunteer a significant portion of time, maintain personal needs, and carry adequate medical and hospitalization insurance.
- ♦ A willingness to work 30-40 hours per week and a minimum of four weeks.
- An acceptance that volunteers may be rotated in and out of the program in order to allow more people to share in this meaningful experience.

Our Volunteers Work!

Areas of need include:

- Transportation drivers to pick up and return guests to the airport and train station
- Troster Arts Studio assistants for ceramics, stained glass and lapidary (we will train!)
- Children's Center assistants to care for children (infants through preschool)
- Country Store and Worldwide Gifts staff
 with basic retail experience
- Food Service: dining room and Ollie's Place
- Camp Ranger
- · Greenhouse, grounds and flowers
- Maintenance: general/hotel/lodge
- Office Assistants





Volunteers are asked to serve in time blocks of four weeks (minimum) to six weeks (preferred) to a full season from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Volunteers select

how many weeks they are available to serve. The

early season is May 15-July 30; late season is August 1-September 6.

Housing is provided. The number of rooms available is somewhat limited. When needed, we ask volunteers to consider alternative options in dates of service and rotate the housing that is available. Many volunteers own trailers in our seasonal campgrounds and receive 25% off their annual camping fee when serving full time.

Volunteer housing is one to two miles away on the grounds, so volunteers need to have their own transportation.

Travel is at each volunteer's expense, but it is deductible on income taxes as a charitable contribution.

Green Lake's staff begins the selection process in late fall by matching applicants to positions with the intent of completing the process by the end of December. Applicants will be advised of their status as soon as possible, no later than April 1.
